Scott Kelby's 7 Step Adjustment Using Lightroom For Raw Photographs as compared to JPEGs

What do I wish was different?

0. Crop

1. White balance
Pull down menu
Sliders
Selector pen

2. Exposure

Auto set white (shift – double click on white)
Auto set black (shift – double click on black)
Slide exposure

3. Fix problems

Clipping – so bright you lose detail Use highlight
Darks – Use shadow

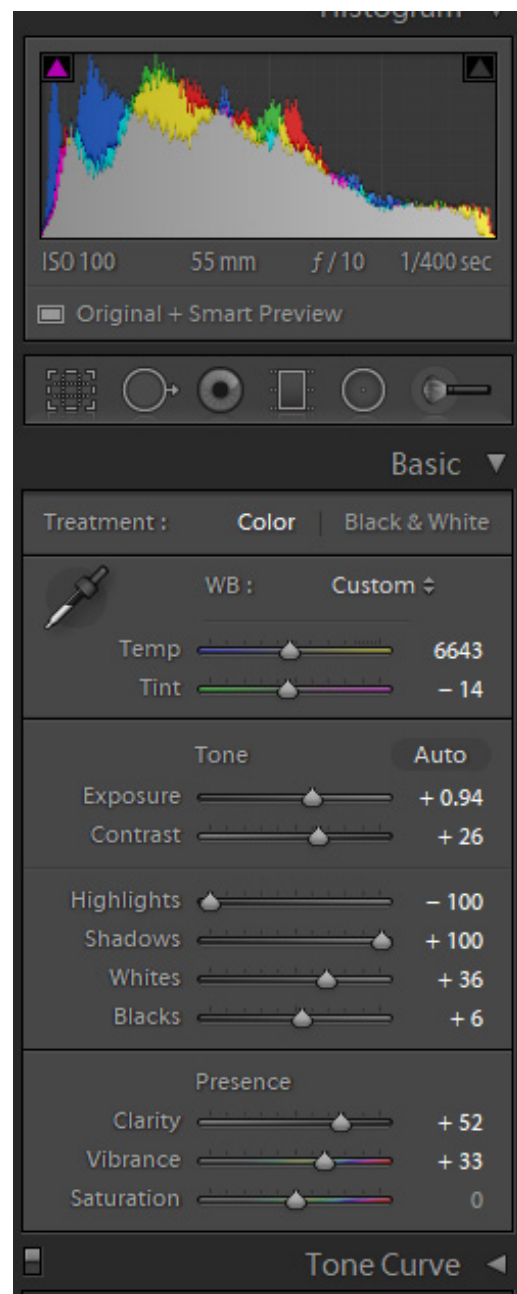
4. (a) Add contrast – Makes black blacker, white whiter, colors vivid
(b) Add clarity (punch) brings out detail, dimensions, texture, sharpens

5. (a) Adjustment Brush:
Areas needing Dodging (brighter) or Burning (Darker) using adjustment brush, Dehaze
(b) Graduated filter (lower highlight & add white balance blue to make skies prettier)
(c) Radial Tool to create spotlight by default inside unaffected, feather

6. (a) Correcting Lens Problems – check “Enable Profile Corrections
(b) Transform – Select “Auto” to let Lightroom fix aberrations from lens

7. Finishing –

- (a) Sharpening – Amount varies, Radius 1.0, Detail 25
Masking varies
Hold down alt key while moving Masking slider
- (b) Vibrance – Smart saturation!!
- (c) Vignette - -11
