Anastasia Williams was our Program Director for the June Meeting. She showed the Great Courses Photography II Lesson on taking photographs in and around water. While we were shown some "make at home" ways to take water photographs, a major point was that water and most cameras do not play well together!! Disaster could await you!

We had many beautiful photographs in our "out of focus" photography challenge. Many of the photographers used a shallow depth of field to blur details. Congratulations to Ann Newman, Grace Bradmon and Janice Morris! Next month's photo challenge is insects.

Next month's program will be still life photography. It is an opportunity for you to bring your camera and take some pictures. Bring your camera and objects to photograph. This will provide us opportunities to take a variety of pictures and learn from each other!

Still Life Photography

Consider lighting - natural, table lamps, flashlights, reflectors (aluminum foil, white paper) Use a tripod if you have one.

Consider background - cloth, tri-fold, clothing, gift wrap, wallpaper, walls

Compose the shot - make sure there are no distractions

Shoot from different perspectives and angles, as well as different aperature settings.

Take your time

Look at other's still life photographs for ideas

Look around your home for inspiration

Look at your camera's manual for directions to change your Aperature setting (depth of field)
