April's Meeting

Congratulations to Grace Bradmon for her first place photograph "April Showers" in our photographic challenge. Congratulations to Dave Richter (2nd place) and Cathy Butcher (3rd place).

Janice Morris, April's Program Director, arranged for **Steve Heap** to present on the topic of Stock Photography. Steve has been a lifelong photographer with a passion for landscapes and nature imagery. After hearing admiring comments from friends about his photos, he decided, in 2008, to try to sell them. He shared his experiences through a wonderful presentation which opened many members' eyes to new ideas of how to share and profit from their photos. Steve explained how he built his business through the years to the current level where he uploads and sells images to multiple vendors. Shutterstock has been the company through which he has sold the most photographs. He said that in 2014 the industry average income made through stock photography was \$17,000 while the median was \$4000.

He emphasized the importance of keywording (in Lightroom) before uploading which enables buyers to find photographs which meet their needs for design or by an editor. He explained the difference of photographs being used for editorial vs. commercial purposes. Also, he shared how he tries to anticipate topics for which photographs may be needed and creates photographs on that topic. He uploads both unaltered photographs and composite photographs. He is now branching out to stock videos. His bestselling book which can be found on Amazon is: *Getting Started in Stock: 2017 Edition*. It is a step by step guide to microstock photography.
